#### Key dates for the Children's Book Award 2019

The 12 testing groups are hard at work voting on all the books the publishers are sending them for consideration for the 2019 award. The final votes will be counted in January and they will meet to finalise the Top 10 and Pick of the Year in early February. The list will be announced on Monday 25th February so keep an eye on the FCBG blog!

We're looking to extend participation in voting as widely as possible and we'll be in touch with you all nearer the date with a special deal to purchase sets of the Top 10 books at discounted rates from our main 2019 sponsor BookLife Publishing.

Voting will run until mid-May 2019 and the winners will be announced at the CBA Ceremony on 8th

## Invitation to join the National Executive Committee (NEC)

A number of opportunities to support the work of FCBG at national level will be arising over the next few months as a result of several members retiring or changing their role. We would therefore like to invite anyone interested in joining the NEC to get in touch to express their interest. The roles we are particularly keen to fill are:

**Secretary**: as one of the four officers and the first point of contact for the Federation, this role is of key importance and we therefore suggest that the incoming secretary should shadow the current post holder initially, followed by a gradual handover. The post would best suit someone who is not in full-time employment. The roles includes managing <u>info@fcbg.org.uk</u>, editing and distributing UpdaTED and overseeing membership.


**Newsletter Editor**: this involves commissioning, collecting and editing the content for the Newsletter which is sent to members twice a year, submitting it to our printers, proof reading and organising printing and distribution.

**Website Coordinator**: this involves organising and posting blogs and updating the website content as required. The post holder would not be expected to write all the content for the blog programme, but could contribute occasionally if they wanted to. Some blogs will be submitted by other Exec members and others will be invited from contributors (authors, illustrators, publishers and book experts). It is essential that the post holder is familiar with Wordpress. Technical trouble-shooting is done by another agency.

All members of NEC should be FCBG members and in the case of the officers, members of a Children's Book Group. The NEC meets 4 times a year on Saturday in London, for which travel expenses will be reimbursed. Primary schools will automatically receive tokens, but still need to register to ensure they receive the correct number. Secondary schools, nurseries and playgroups will not receive tokens unless they register.

The registration period closes on 30th November - so don't delay - this is a great

way to ensure that all young readers can own a book! Tokens can be used in participating book shops from Thursday 28th February to Sunday 31st March 2019.


Expect a programme packed with live

## Shaun Tan Hide and Seek

To coincide with the launch of Shaun Tan's *Tales from the Inner City,* Walker Studio are encouraging people to take part in a nationwide pebble hunt. Shaun has hand painted 5 unique pebbles which have been hidden across the country for treasure hunters to find, share on social media and then re-hide.



Everyone is encouraged to become part of this project by designing and creating their own pebbles painted with themes inspired by the natural world then hiding their stones for others to find and share. Walker Studio will be keeping a keen eye on new editions to the treasure hunt and will be awarding some of the most visually arresting pebbles with limited edition signed Shaun Tan prints.

#### Want to get involved? Here's how...

- 1. Find a smooth pebble or stone It can be any size
- 2. Paint it with a design inspired by nature and mark it on the reverse with #shauntanpebble (we recommend using acrylic paints)
- 3. Varnish it with weather proof varnish leave it to dry
- 4. Find a special place to hide your stone or pebble in an urban setting (NB: Must be in a public space/land Must be in a town or city Must in a safely accessible location No damage should be caused to access the pebble Should be away from busy roads Discreet but visible Do not bury the pebble)
- 5. When hidden...Take a photo of the pebble, art side up, in its location.
- 6. Share a photo online with the hashtag #shauntanpebble leaving some clues as to its location and tagging @walkerstudio and @shauncytan
